Entries: All entries must be received in the Old Home Week office by entry closing dates. Fax or phone entries will be held for processing pending the receipt of original entry forms and fees.

Please read the general rules & regulations and for the particular section that you are entering carefully, and if you have any questions, please call the office or a committee member.

No cruelty to any animal will be tolerated on the grounds of Old Home Week.

The Old Home Week Office, Staff and Committee are referred to as OHW throughout this book.

Prize money will be mailed out by the second week of September. If you have not received your prize money by October 15th, please contact the Old Home Week Office.

Midway: Campbell Amusements is a family owned Midway who feature rides, games and food & beverage concession booths for both the public and Exhibitors. The Midway opens at noon daily.

Food & A food fair will be situated in the Trade Centre and food vendors are located

Beverages: Throughout the midway grounds. There is also a canteen and Tim Hortons in the hallway between the Trade & Civic Centre.

Security: There will be security guards on the grounds 24 hours a day from August 11-20 but please do not leave valuables sitting around in the open. OHW is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

First Aid: The CPR First Aid and Safety Services will be staffing the First Aid Room located in the hallway in the Civic Centre daily from 10am-10pm, outside of this time, please call 911.

General Rules & Regulations

1. All entries for exhibits, shows, sales or displays during Old Home Week are subject to the Rules &

Regulations and any violation will subject the exhibitors to such penalty as the OHW Livestock Committee may consider appropriate in the circumstances.

2. The interpretation placed on any of the rules & regulations of Old Home Week, or the decisions arrived at in regard to any dispute, shall be final. The OHW Livestock Committee reserves the right to interpret all rules & regulations governing the Old Home Week and to make decisions necessary for the success of the show. Any exhibitor, who violates any of the rules and regulations, shall forfeit all premiums that they may be subject to, and will be assessed any other penalties that may be deemed appropriate. General rules & regulations are applicable to each department of Old Home Week. ***The rules & regulations contained in this book are the conditions under which all entries are accepted. Exhibitors are urged to study these rules carefully before making application for entries.***

3. All applications for entries must be made on the official entry form and please ensure that all ***areas are completed properly*** and all requested information is entered. ***Entry fees must accompany the entry form.*** These forms are to be received by the OHW Office on or before the specified closing dates since entries could be restricted due to space limitations.

4. Late entries will be accepted with a penalty of \$5 per entry. The late charge must accompany the entry form and fee in order to be processed by the Old Home Week office. In case of cancellations due to unforeseen circumstances by the exhibitor, entry fees will be refunded after August 31, 2010. ***Entry fee refunds will be provided on complete breed entry, not on single entries.*** A letter stating the reason why cancellation was required must be sent to the OHW office.

5. All exhibits shall be under control of Old Home Week, but solely at the risk of the exhibitor. Old Home Week will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss or theft of or to any exhibit, irrespective of cause of such damage, injury, loss or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify Old Home Week against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.

6. No exhibit deemed unworthy by the judge shall be awarded a premium.

7. Prize Money will be mailed in September, if you have not received your prize money by October 15th, please contact the Old Home Week office. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to prevent an exhibitor from showing or to withhold all or any prize money from an exhibitor in any circumstance in which their opinion justifies such action.

8. Old Home Week will not be responsible for non-payment of prizes (special or otherwise) offered by others.

9. No exhibit will be allowed to compete for a championship or special prize unless it has been shown in a regular class. Only exhibits that have received 1st or 2nd prize in the regular classes will be eligible to compete for championships or special prizes.

Ribbons will be awarded as follows:

1 st Red	4 th Yellow
2 nd Blue	5 th Green
3 rd White	

Grand Champion Rosette Red, White, Blue

Reserve Champion Rosette Royal Purple

10. Exhibitors are not permitted to remove exhibits before designated times without authority of the OHW Livestock Committee. ***Any failure to comply with this rule will result in forfeiture of all prize money.*** All exhibitors requesting late arrival and early departure outside of specified times must have requested permission with their entry forms. Each application will be discussed on an individual basis by the OHW Agriculture Coordinator.

11. Protests: All protests must be in writing, signed, and accompanied by a deposit of \$25 which shall be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. The protest must state fully the cause of the complaint, and must be delivered to the OHW Agriculture Coordinator within 24 hours of the cause of the protest.

12. ***Decision of the Judges will be final!*** Any exhibitor, who by himself, his agent or servant, or any individual interferes with or shows disrespect to any Judge during the performance of his/her duties or on the grounds or premises of Old Home Week into disrepute, shall be subject to any or all forfeitures and/or penalties provided for in rule #1 of these rules.

13. Alcoholic beverages are permitted in designated areas. ***All alcoholic beverages must be in plastic glasses.***
14. The law does not permit smoking in any enclosed area on PEI, there is absolutely no smoking permitted in the Charlottetown Civic, Trade Centre or Livestock tents.
15. Every Cattle and Horse exhibitor ***must submit a copy of their animal liability Insurance with their entry form.***
16. **Management reserves the right that should an exhibitor be currently engaged in litigation, either civil or criminal, that their entry may be refused.**

Livestock Rules & Regulations

1. ***Ownership:*** All animals must be entered in the name(s) of the registered owner(s). Any party loaning animals to another party for the purpose of exhibiting shall be equally responsible with the exhibitor. Except where specified otherwise, all articles or animals entered must be bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of submitting the entry. In classes requiring animals to be bred and owned by the exhibitor, the name of the breeder must correspond to the name of the owner by the exhibitor, the name of the breeder must correspond to the name of the owner as shown on the pedigree, except in cases where the exhibitor was a member of a firm or partnership and has purchased the interest of the others concerned, or where the exhibitor has been previously associated with the management of the herd and is now owner by virtue of direct inheritance. A joint ownership entry must be made on a separate entry form.
2. ***Registration of Animals:*** All purebred males and females of Canadian origin must be recorded in the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation or the herd or stud books of associations operating their own recording systems. The breeder of an animal will be the person recorded as such on the registration certificate. The criteria for being purebred are based on the accepted standards named by the specific breed association.
3. ***Production of Certificates:*** Exhibitors are required to provide pedigrees/registration certificates of animals entered in purebred classes upon request. All animals must be properly and legibly tattooed and registered at the time entries close. Certificates will be checked prior to judging. Failure to produce certificates will result in an exhibitor not receiving prize money for the animal(s). Prize money will be paid upon the receipt of certificate(s) if received before August 31st, 2011..
4. ***Groups:*** Animals comprising an exhibit in a group class must have been entered and shown in their respective classes for single animals, except in classes where it is permissible to include an animal for which no class for single animals is provided.
5. ***Stalls:*** Stalls and pens for livestock will be allotted by the OHW Agriculture Coordinator. Exhibitors installing fittings in a stall do so subject to the Livestock Committee's right to enter the stall and remove such fittings when, in the opinion of management, it is desirable to do so to cope with stabling requirements or to comply with fire safety regulations. It shall be the duty of Agriculture Coordinator to prevent an exhibitor from utilizing too many stalls or pens or from unduly crowding his/her animals; to regulate the use of stalls or pens for purposes other than accommodating animals. Stalls will be assigned at the discretion of the OHW Agriculture Coordinator based on the number of entries an exhibitor brings to Old Home Week. **The OHW Agriculture Coordinator's decision is final!**
6. ***Bedding:*** No bedding will be provided but may be purchased on the Old Home Week grounds. **Exhibitors are not permitted to store more than a day's worth of bedding and feed near their exhibit due to space limitations.**
7. ***Manure:*** Manure must be removed by the exhibitor and taken to the specified containers by disposal. All garbage must be placed in the garbage containers. Exhibitors must bring their own manure carts to move their manure to disposal containers. The committee requests that exhibitors clean up the aisles after their animals. **In the Horse Dome, manure and bedding must be completely removed from stalls and put in designated area upon departure.**
8. ***Fitting of Animals:*** All fitting of animals must be done in the designated areas. No fitting is to be in the aisles during Old Home Week, August 11th - 20st. Failure to comply will result in exhibitor incurring cleaning costs.
9. ***Arrival & Release of Exhibits:*** The arrival and release times are listed in each section. These times are to be followed unless a request for permission for late arrival and/or early release. The application form, which is in this package, must be completed and returned with entry form.

10. **Sick Animals:** The OHW Livestock Committee reserve the right to refuse admission of any animal showing evidence of infections or contagious diseases or other reasons. The OHW Committee reserves the right to have all livestock examined by a veterinarian if deemed necessary.
11. **Show attire:** All exhibitors shall be neatly dressed throughout Old Home Week. All Exhibits must display an Exhibitor Sign and information cards for each animal that is exhibited.
12. **Exhibitors' Passes:** Passes are available to all exhibitors. Please fill in the number required and include payment with entry fees. Exhibitor passes are \$20 before July 31 and will provide admission for 1 person for the entire week. The passes will be \$25 after August 1st. Day admission during Old Home Week is \$9 for adults, \$5 for kids age 6-12 and 5 and under if Free!
13. **Exhibitors' Parking:** Old Home Week has parking for livestock trailers at the back of the Park Street Parking Lot - please park as far back on the grassy area as possible. There is a parking lot on Park Street available for exhibitors for a daily or weekly fee. The parking spots on the Old Home Week grounds (if any) are reserved for Handicap parking only. **Vehicles parked on site after 9am WILL BE TOWED AT THE OWNERS EXPENSE WITH NO WARNING**
14. **Exhibitors' Gates:** The Exhibitors' gate is located on Kensington Road. This gate is to be used for arrivals, releases and deliveries only. Deliveries are to be made between 7-9AM. A walk in gate is located on Park Street across from the parking lot.
15. **Substitutions:** Two substitutions are allowed within a section per exhibitor and must be made at the OHW office upon arrival.
16. **NSF Cheques:** All cheques returned NSF will incur a charge of \$30.00 payable to PEI Provincial Exhibition within 7 days of returned cheque,

Old Home Week Horse Pull Rules & Regulations

ENTRY FORMS ARE DUE BY July 29th at \$10

ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNTIL August 11th at \$20

ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED

ON DAY OF PULL

ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER AND PAY ENTRY FEE IN FULL BY CLOSING DATE.

ALL EXHIBITORS MUST INCLUDE PROOF OF LIABILITY INSURANCE WITH ENTRY FORM AND FEE.

1. Horses will be weighed with halter and loose shank.
2. **Absolutely no butt-reins or over the hand with the reins will be allowed at the drag, rail , coming or going to and from the drag. Light use of reins in forward of hand is permitted.**
3. All horses are subject to drug testing. No drugs are allowed. Feed and water buckets are disallowed once the horse pull has started. If anyone is caught using them they will be disqualified.
4. Divisions as follows:

Light Teams	0- 2900 lbs (starting load 3000 lbs)
Middle Teams	2901-3300 lbs. (starting load 4000 lbs.)
Heavy Teams	3301- over lbs. (starting load 5000 lbs.)
5. The pulling position for the teamster will be the lightest team to drag first. The heaviest team last in each division.
6. Pulling distance will be 12 ft. Two attempts to move the drag the required distance. The winner of the Pull will be the team that moves the drag the most inches on the heaviest load. Three minutes to complete the pull from the time your name is called.
7. Any movement of the drag will be called a Try once the teamster has hooked his team to the drag. No excessive hauling of the drag. The teamster has the discretion to stay hooked to the drag or unhook between his two tries.
8. Lines will be 14 ft. apart. Any horses stepping on the line while hooked to the drag will be counted as a Try but disallowed as a good Pull.
9. If teams steps on the line before being unhooked from the drag on a good Pull it will be disallowed. Horses must stay in between lines until unhooked from the drag.
10. Any teamster swinging on the team intentionally will be disqualified.
11. No roughing horses coming or leaving the drag or you will be disqualified. No cruelty to horses on pulling grounds.
12. Any teamster starting the Pull with a team must stay with that same team for the entire Pull. With the exception of injury.
13. Teams will pull round robin style or single class depending on the number of teams.
14. If any team becomes unmanageable or difficult to handle and becomes dangerous to the public the judge and officials have the right to and will disqualify the team and order the team from the pulling area.
15. After horses are hooked to the drag one teamster only. No heading of horses unless in case of breakage or the horses are tangled up. In case of breakage then the team will go get fixed up while the Pull continues but has to come back and pull on the last of that load before more weight is added or ten minutes.
16. Any teamster judged to be under the influence of alcohol will not be allowed to compete.
17. Concerning all teams: If any horse of any team is so blemished, in poor condition, or lame, the judge shall have the right to eliminate that team.
18. After horses are hooked to the drag, hookers must step back and not talk or whistle at horses.
19. Teamsters will not exercise their team in pulling arena.
20. Each horse is only allowed in one class.
21. Horses must have on halters and be tied up in pulling arena.
22. In all cases, the judge's decision will be final. Failure to comply promptly will result in immediate disqualification.
23. Any situation that arises that has not been covered in the above will be the decision of the

judge and/or the horse pull committee.

Prize Money & Awards

Prize money will be awarded in each division as follows:

1st \$300(plus award) 2nd \$250 3rd \$200 4th \$150 5th \$100 6th \$75

Exhibitors not receiving prize money will be given a participation award of \$50
